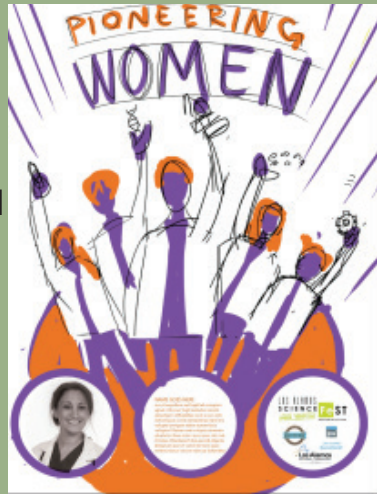

In honor of the centennial anniversary of women's right to vote, Los Alamos MainStreet, Los Alamos Chamber of Commerce, the Los Alamos Historical Society, LANL and Triad, LLC and Del Norte Credit Union are debuting posters July 7-12 featuring women in Los Alamos who have been pioneers in advancing their respective fields, from the Manhattan Project days, to today. Local businesses and organizations around Los Alamos County will be displaying these posters throughout the summer. 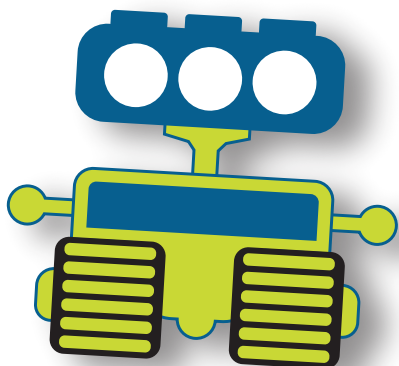

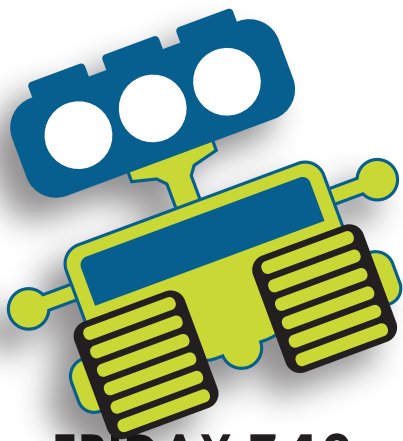

**Location: Los Alamos Creative District, near Fuller Lodge**

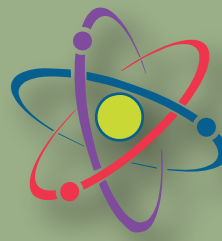
